



Continuing Eligibility

North Carolina's ESA+ Scholarship Program

What is your student's current documentation date?

Pay attention to the **year (not the month or day).*

1. Add 3 to the year.
 - *If the current date is 2023: **2023 + 3 = 2026***
 - *Your student's documentation is valid through 2026.*
2. *Start the re-evaluation process in the spring of 2026.*
3. *As of January 1, 2027, the documentation is outdated, the student is no longer eligible for ESA+ funds and will be removed from the program.*



Continuing Eligibility: How?

Option 1:

Eligibility Determination from a North Carolina public school IEP team

- Contact your local public school
- Request a re-evaluation
- A full IEP is not required
- Seek an updated **Eligibility Determination**

Option 2*:

Continuing Eligibility form

- Signed by a **North Carolina licensed psychiatrist** OR by a **North Carolina licensed psychologist** with a school psychology focus

*Exceptions:

- Change in disability
- Developmental Delay

The three-year cycle begins with the date of the most recent IEP Eligibility Determination or previous Continuing Eligibility date on file with SEAA. You will receive email reminders in MyPortal when it is time to complete the re-evaluation.
